Primary School PE and Sports Funding

2018- 2019

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

What we are using the funding for:

Reevo Coaching	<p>We have recognised the need to hire coaches to work alongside teachers in the school, in order to upskill the teachers in aspects of PE that they have found difficult.</p> <p>We also want to give children the opportunities to experience a variety of sports, and develop inter-school competition and participation in festivals.</p> <p>Teachers felt that these coaching sessions were not enhancing their teaching skills and therefore it was decided not to continue with this company.</p>	£2,300
Skip to be Fit	<p>Following the success and positive feedback we received from a previous year of employing Dave, we have again bought into these sessions.</p> <p>All children from Y1 – 6 benefitted from two terms of Skip to be Fit/Box to be Fit. These have been very successful throughout the school, with all children participating in a high impact PE session each week.</p>	£340 + VAT 1 day per week
After-school Clubs	<p>To provide sport afterschool clubs for children.</p> <p>Children in years 1 to 6 all had the opportunity to attend a sport after school club. After school sporting clubs were well attended by children.</p>	£20 per sessions £600 total
Lunch time coaches	<p>To provide lunchtime activities and support (5 days a week) during Summer term.</p> <p>Children throughout the school benefit from an extra adult on the yard to engage in activities with.</p>	£500 per week £ 1100 total
Enrichment and enhancement activities	<p>Dance City – 2 half days for all children Y1 - Y6</p> <p>Y1,2,3 had the opportunity to participate in Glow Stick Dance and Y4,5,6 participated in Street Dance.</p>	£140
Transport to sporting events and festivals	<p>Transport to be provided for children and adults to sporting events.</p> <p>Children were able to take part in sporting events in different environments such as Tennis, Soccertots, cricket festivals and multi skills activities.</p>	£500
R A T S	<p>To provide enhanced outdoor activities to KS2 children.</p> <p>KS2 children have improved their co-operation and team working skills.
